## RULES AND REGULATIONS

- All exhibitors must comply with animal health regulations for exhibitors and general rules and regulations listed in the front of this premium book.
- Amateur, Novice Amateur and Novice Youth exhibitors must show their 2007 Amateur cards in order to exhibit at this show.
- All entries will be POST ENTRIES. Entries will be made before the classes on Saturday and Sunday.
- STALL RESERVATIONS: All horses must be stalled. \$40 per stall. Call Jackie Mead to reserve stalls: 816-792-5827.
- ENTRY FEES PER JUDGE:  
Office and APHA charge - \$8.00 per horse per judge  
Open Classes - \$8.00 per class or \$30.00 all day  
Novice Amateur Classes - \$8.00 per class or \$30.00 all day  
Amateur Classes - \$8.00 per class or \$30.00 all day  
Youth Classes - \$5.00 per class or \$15.00 all day  
All day fee allows the "1 horse/1 rider" exhibitor to show in all applicable classes at no extra charge.
- SPECIAL CLASSES: The MPHC will sponsor the Show Me Shootout Classes. All with payback. For information: Clea Bobbitt, 573-392-7885.
- Youth and Amateur I.D. numbers and social security number must be on the entry form.
- The director of the Missouri State Fair or manager of the horse show reserves the right to reject any entry without being held liable for damage of any kind.
- Exhibitors may bring in feed, forage and bedding for their own use (not for sale) during the Paint Horse Show. Space in the barns is for livestock exhibit purpose and may not be used for storage of feed or bedding. Feed and bedding will be available on the fairgrounds.
- Only the show manager and/or stall superintendent has authority to assign or reassign stalls.
- PARKING RULES FOR PAINT HORSE SHOW: All vehicles must be parked away from the barns except while loading and unloading horses. Parking for the Paint Horse Show is recommended east of the Coliseum next to the track fence and north of the Dairy Cattle barns. Vehicles parked in prohibited areas will be subject to tow. Horses are not to be tied to vehicles parked along the streets.
- The Inner Campground will be available for those persons wishing to camp. Camping hook-ups along the street by the Woman's Building and the Administration Building are not to be used.
- Courtesy to Judge and Officials - Exhibitors are notified that any act of discourtesy or disobedience by them, their riders, drivers, grooms or agents to the judge or officials shall disqualify their entry and the owner shall forfeit any fees and all other charges including any and all prize money which he may have won at the show. The Horse Show Committee shall have full power to act in issuing a ruling and such shall

have power to disbar the offending individual from further competition and have him and his entire exhibit removed from the grounds **without being held liable for damage of any kind and this shall be accepted as a condition of entry.**

No one may approach a judge with regard to a decision unless he/she first obtains permission from the show manager or ring steward.

- Neither the Missouri State Fair nor the horse show manager will be responsible for any article of any kind or nature that may be lost, destroyed, or stolen, although every precaution will be taken to protect property of the exhibitors. Also, the Missouri State Fair and the horse show manager or superintendent will not be responsible or liable for any injury sustained in any way to exhibitors, spectators or employees.

## ANIMAL HEALTH REQUIREMENTS FOR EXHIBITION

### 1. EXHIBITION REQUIREMENTS EQUIDAE.

- Intrastate (equine in Missouri moving for exhibition only).
  - Equine that are to be exhibited must be free of clinical signs of an Infectious or contagious disease. Any equidae showing signs of infectious or contagious diseases at an exhibition may be excused by the official inspecting veterinarian. When an official inspecting veterinarian is present; all equidae will be subject to daily inspection.
  - A Certificate of Veterinary Inspection is not required
  - All equidae (except nursing foals accompanied by their dams) must be accompanied by a current VS Form 10-11 or any officially recognized state EIA test chart showing the graphic description of all markings needed for identification, or microchip, or legible tattoo, or unique registered brand. A certified photocopy or certified facsimile of the VS Form 10-11 or any officially recognized state EIA test chart may be accepted for the purpose of exhibition.
- Interstate (equine from another state entering Missouri for exhibition only).
  - Equine that are to be exhibited must be free of clinical signs of an infectious or contagious disease. Any equidae showing signs of infectious or contagious diseases at an exhibition may be excused by the official inspecting veterinarian. When an official inspecting veterinarian is present; all equidae will be subject to daily inspection.
  - A Certificate of Veterinary Inspection is required.
  - All equidae (except nursing foals accompanied by their dams) must be accompanied by a current VS Form 10-11 or any officially recognized state EIA test chart showing the graphic description of all markings needed for identification, or microchip, or legible tattoo, or unique registered brand. A certified photocopy or certified facsimile of the VS Form 10-11 or any officially recognized state EIA test chart may be accepted for the purpose of exhibition.
  - Alteration or substitution of any information on any VS Form 10-11 including certified photocopy or certified facsimile or any official copy of a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection shall cause the document to be invalid and in violation of sections 267.010 to 267.730, RSMo, and may result in civil penalties not to exceed ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) per violation and subject to expulsion.
  - A six (6)-month passport from states with which there is a reciprocal agreement will be accepted in lieu of VS Form 10-11. These passports must have proof of a negative EIA test within thirty (30) days of the date of application of the passport and permanent identification for each horse by means of registered brand, legible tattoo, or microchip to be recorded on the passport and the VS Form 10-11 or any officially recognized state EIA test chart, along with other identifying characteristics. In the event of confirmed vesicular stomatitis in any of the states with which reciprocal agreements exist, use of the six (6)-month passport will be suspended by the state veterinarian of Missouri.
  - Venezuelan Equine Encephalomyelitis (VEE) vaccination and entry permit is required prior to entry on equidae originating from states in which VEE has been diagnosed within the preceding twelve (12) months.
  - Any equine originating from a premise under quarantine for Vesicular Stomatitis shall obtain an entry permit and must include the statement on the Certificate of Veterinary Inspection that "the equine listed have not been exposed to Vesicular Stomatitis or located within (10) miles of premises quarantined for Vesicular Stomatitis within the past thirty (30) days".
- The board, organization or manager of each assembly or event is responsible for certifying that all equidae admitted or participating meet the regulations in this section and shall not admit or allow participation of equidae not so certified. Untested equidae shall not be allowed to congregate with other equidae. The owner of

each animal shall comply with requirements under this section 267.010. to 267.730, RSMo, and may be assessed civil penalties not to exceed ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) for each violation.
