U.S. GRAND NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP HORSE SHOW Show Rules, Entry Fees & Stabling Information

- 1. The 2010 AAALSHA U.S. Grand National Championship Horse Show is an approved All American Andalusian and Lusitano Show Horse Alliance (AAALSHA) competition. A Show Steward approved by the Show Committee shall be present to administer these rules at the show.
- 2. Show rules, including ANCCE and Dancing Horse rules, will be available in the horse show office. Rules and specifications for all classes will be listed on our website (www.andalusian-lusitano-alliance.com). If you would like a paper copy, please contact Nancy Nathanson at 805-448-3027 (thepark@hwy246.net).
- 3. All horses must be registered with or application for registration must have been made with any recognized Andalusian/Lusitano registry, making this competition open to IALHA, PRE, PRE Mundial, Lusitano, S/P and all recognized Half-Andalusian registries. Copies of Registration Papers/Carta (front & back) must be submitted.
- 4. The Horse Show Executive Committee reserves the right to itself, to interpret all questions and conditions in regard to, or arising out of, or incident to, the show, without claims for damages or recourse of any kind. Any questions not covered in these rules and regulations shall be decided by the Horse Show Executive Committee, their decision to be final. The Horse Show Executive Committee is to consist of Horse Show Manager, Horse Show Secretary, and a representative of the AAALSHA Show Committee.
- **5. All entries are accepted** with the understanding that AAASHA, the AAALSHA U.S. Grand National Championship Horse Show and the National Equestrian Center will not be held responsible for any loss, damage, or any injury to any horse exhibited or any article of any kind. All horses shall be under the control and direction of the Show Committee but solely at the risk of the exhibitor, who will be responsible for any loss, damage or injury to any person, animal or property occasioned by him, his agents or employees, or by an animal owned or exhibited by him, and shall indemnify AAALSHA, its Directors and Agents, the AAALSHA U.S. Grand National Championship Horse Show and the National Equestrian Center against any and all loss, damage and liability thus occasioned, including but not limited to any and all legal costs, including attorney fees, which may be incurred as a result thereof. The submitting of an entry form to the Show shall constitute an acceptance by each person signing same of the provisions herein set forth.
- **6. All owners and exhibitors** will be held responsible for any damage incurred by them or their agents or employees to barns or National Equestrian Center property on the show grounds and will be billed accordingly. Stalls must be left in original condition with the exception of shavings and horse manure. Anything brought to the grounds must be removed from the grounds by the end of the show.
- **7. AAALSHA Membership: All Owners must be members of AAALSHA.** All others, except the parent or guardian of a minor, must pay the appropriate non-member fee or be a member of AAALSHA. (See Fee Schedule for appropriate fees.)
- 8. **Minors** who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate (Continued)

a motorized vehicle of any kind including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. Violations of this rule will be cause for sanctions against the parent(s), guardian(s) and/or trainer(s) who are responsible for the child committing the offense. Penalties may include exclusion of the child, parent(s), guardian(s) and/or trainer(s) from the competition grounds for the remainder of the competition. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

- **9.Management reserves the right** to refuse, accept conditionally, or cancel any entries, and to cancel award prizes, without claims for damages; to change any course, to cancel or combine any unfilled classes; and to change judges or other officials.
- 10. Class Schedules: The class schedule included in this booklet *is tentative*. <u>PLEASE</u> <u>NOTE THE FOLLOWING</u>: Management reserves the right to adjust the class schedule and class order. If entries warrant, performance may begin earlier or later than published. If entries warrant, classes may be split. Please check with the horse show office for each day's final schedule.
- **11. Class Fees.** All classes \$100.00 (Exception: no charge for leadline. Futurity requires a nominaton fee, \$150. Significant Sires© Open Entry Fee, \$300)
- 12. Entries: To be accepted, the entry blank must be COMPLETELY filled out and accompanied by a check or credit card information covering all fees and proof of a negative Coggins Test dated within 1 year of the show and a Health Certificate dated within 30 days of the show for each out-of-state horse. In the case of a minor the entry blank must be signed by the parent or guardian. If there is no trainer, the entry blank *must* be signed by the owner.
- **13. In order to qualify** for a National Champion or Grand National Champion Class, the horse or youth must have shown and been judged in the class in which they wish to show at any Breed Show featuring the Andalusian/Lusitano or Part Bred Andalusian/Lusitano Horse. (See list of Qualifying Shows on our website: www. andalusian-lusitano-alliance.com. Qualification is not required for PRE, PSL, S/P, and Sport Horse In Hand, Dancing Horses or ANCCE classes.
- 14. All horses may be drug tested on a random basis.
- **15. All horses two years old and over** may have their hooves measured by the Show Steward on a random basis.
- 16. Judging Judging of AAALSHA National Champion and National Grand Champion halter and performance classes will be by a three judge panel. Each class will have a Call Judge determined on a random rotating basis. Placings will be based on the combined scores of all judges. The Call Judge's placement will break all ties. The entry with the highest total points will be awarded National or National Grand Champion; the entry with the second highest total score will be awarded Reserve National or Reserve National Grand Champion; and the remainder of the Top Five

(unranked) will be third, fourth & fifth highest scores. Exception: National Grand Champion Dancing Horse Classes will be judged by two judges who will jointly consult and give one decision.

- 17. Closing date: Sept. 1, 2010. Entries must be postmarked by Sept. 1, 2010.
- **18.** Post Entries are accepted with penalty. Post Entry Fee if entry made at show is \$25.00 per horse. Late Fees. A late fee of \$10.00 per class if not entered by closing date.
- **19. Refunds.** Entries will only be refunded (less a \$25 handling fee) if a Vet Certificate is received within five days of the event. No refunds on stabling fees. If classes are canceled due to severe weather or other emergency, refunds of entry fees will be made upon written request by the exhibitor within 30 days of the cancellation.
- **20. Office Fee.** There is an Office Fee of \$25 per horse. (This is a one-time fee, which includes the Qualifier, Dressage and AAALSHA shows.)
- **21. Class Calls.** Due to unforseeable problems with any mechanical device, the PA System and paddock calls must be considered a courtesy. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to be sure that his horse is at the gate at the prescribed time. Every effort will be made to maintain a working PA System to carry class calls, however, no protest will be upheld, nor will any class be changed on the basis of PA malfunctions alone. The two minute gate rule will be strictly enforced. The in gate will be closed two minutes after the first horse enters the ring.
- **22. Stalls,** whether occupied by horses, feed or tack, will be available for a fee of \$150 each for the entire show. (**No first bedding**)
- **23. Stall availability.** 10' x 10' permanent stalls with doors and concrete floors will be available on Monday, September 27, 2010, after 9 am and must be vacated by Sunday night, October 3, 2010. Early arrivals \$50 per stall per day and may involve moving from one barn/stall to another. Arrangements should be made with Nancy Nathanson (805) 448-3027.
- **24. Shavings MUST be purchased from the National Equestrian Center.** No outside shavings are to be brought in. No straw is allowed in the bedding area. No bedding is included in the stall price. To arrange for delivery of bedding prior to arrival at the show, contact the National Equestrian Center at 636-561-8080. Contact Show Secretary if you have any questions.
- **25.** Hay will be available at the horse show. To arrange for delivery prior to arrival at the show, contact Sensel Forage Farm, David Sensel at 618-458-6414. \$9.00 per bale (average 60 lbs + bales) straight alfalfa or alfalfa/orchard grass.
- **26. Grain and other supplies** will be available at the horse show. To arrange for delivery prior to arrival at the show, contact Green's Country Store at 636-561-6637.
- 27. Biohazard containers will be available in the barn area. Do not place needles,

syringes and medical waste in the trash.

- 28. We love dogs but Dogs are permitted at the show only if they are confined to the stable and tack room area; and they must be kept tied or on a leash. No Dogs Allowed in Arena Buildings or Horse Show Office.
- **29. Arena A** is 240 feet long by 120 feet wide and the warmup for this arena is 200 feet long by 100 feet wide. The footing is composed of sand, dirt and clay.
- **30. Arena B** is 225 feet long by 140 feet wide and the warmup for this arena is 200 feet long by 60 feet wide. The footing is composed of sand, dirt and clay.
- **31. Outdoor Arena** is 700 feet long by 240 feet wide and is composed of all weather footing.
- **32.** Horse Show Office will be open Monday, September 27, 2010 from 9 am to 5 PM. The office will open one hour prior to the first session each day and remain open for 30 minutes after the last class each day. The Horse Office telephone number is 636-561-8080 or 805-448-3027

From the west (Wentzville)



From the Airport:


